The Diploma of English Studies is one of the series of examinations in English, for candidates whose mother tongue is not English, conducted by the University of Cambridge Local Examinations Syndicate. It is awarded to candidates who are successful in the following, at one or more examinations:

Certificate of Proficiency in English, in Grade A or B

(normally taken previously: a five-paper examination in written and spoken English, approved by the Department of Education and Science and recognised by the University of Cambridge as part of the examination requirements for matriculation).

Language and Appreciation paper

Literature etc.

(a choice of three from the four papers set covering texts or authors from English Literature of the 17th to 20th centuries, or topics illustrating British Life and institutions).

(A translation test, in two papers, is available as an option).

The Diploma examination is recognised by the University of Cambridge as part of the requirements for admission to an honours degree course. Its scope and standard are intended to be comparable with the first part (as normally taken after two years of a three or four-year course) of a degree course in a foreign language and its literature at a British university. It is recognised in terms of matriculation or course credits, or as a qualification for teaching, by various universities and official bodies outside Britain, to whom direct enquiry may be made.

The Diploma is awarded in the following grades: FIRST GRADE, Outstanding: SECOND GRADE Upper Division, Very Good: SECOND GRADE Lower Division, Good: THIRD GRADE, Pass.

Results in individual papers, including the translation test where taken, are issued in three passing grades A, B and C and two failing grades D and E. These are indicated on each statement of result issued to candidates.
